#### **Bobby Bird Memorial Awards**

Students from the PAGC First Nations will be recognized and honored for achievements and academic success for the 2021 - 2022 Academic Year.

The Bobby Bird Memorial Awards were established in honor of the late Bobby Bird, who was actively involved in politics. He served his people as Councilor of the Montreal Lake Cree Nation, Vice Chief of the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations, and supporter of educational leadership among First Nations Youth.

#### 1. Eligibility

Six students will be selected from grades 7 – 12 with the following eligibility requirements:

- are nominated by teachers or guidance counselors;
- attain a minimum average of 65%;
- are a First Nations member from one of the PAGC First Nations;
- were full time students in their respective grades 7 12;
- grades 10 12 inclusive must have an official Sk. Ed. Transcripts.

#### 2. Awards

Monetary values of these awards are as follows:

Grade 12	-	\$1,500	Grade 9	-	\$500
Grade 11	-	\$1,000	Grade 8	-	\$500
Grade 10	-	\$ 800	Grade 7	_	\$500

#### 3. Criteria

The awards are based on the following eight categories using a point system:

- Academic Achievement - Effort - Attendance - Athletics

First Nations Language
 Traditional/Cultural Skills
 Community Service
